
A great book to teach children that a little care for your local environment and taking time to think of those around you makes for a joyful world for all.


The Goldfish Boy was my favourite book. It was so interesting that I couldn't put it down. If I had the chance I would read it 20 more times! (William)

I really enjoyed reading Dinkin Dings and Frightening Things from Bug Club as it was so funny and a little crazy! (Layla)




My favourite class book was The Amazing adventures of Adolphus Tips because it put so much into my head that I could imagine! Billie
