


World Book Day

Transition from Year 6 to Year 7

The issue of us not being classed as a feeder school for Ashington Academy was brought up in a debate in the Houses of Parliament within the last few weeks. The purpose of the drop-in session is to seek your views on the educational pathway of our children as they reach Year 6 and beyond.
