This week <u>Year 2</u> finished reading 'Yours Sincerely Giraffe' and enjoyed discussing the book. The children have also been accessing Bug Club reading on the computers.

This week the <u>Nursery</u> children have shared the story 'Noah's Ark'. We learnt that Noah was a good man who took 2 of each animal into the ark that he built and how God sent a rainbow to thank Noah. We learnt the colours of the rainbow, red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. We made a rainbow cake and wore our rainbow coloured clothes on Rainbow Day.

<u>Year 4</u> - This week we have been reading Kenning poems which are a bit like riddles as you get lots of clues about the theme of the poem without the title ever being mentioned. We have even written our own ones for Mother's Day. We have also been reading different Greek Myths including Pandora's Box and Athena and the Olive Tree. We are thoroughly enjoying our class book, Bill's new Frock, and we are loving all the detail of events and the character descriptions, especially poor Bill!

<u>Reception</u> have been learning all about Jungle animals this week. They have really enjoyed singing along to the rhyming song 'Down In the Jungle, where nobody goes......' We have been reading 'Rumble in the Jungle' by Giles Andreae and 'Walking through the Jungle' by Julie Lacome, in which the children loved the vivid colours and illustrations. The children have been writing some fabulous clues about their favourite jungle animals to read to their friends to guess what it could be.

<u>Year 1</u> - This week we have been reading 'Mr Dry Bone and Anancy,' and we used time words to help us sequence the story.
