This week Year 2 have been reading poems about families. The children discussed what they liked about each poem and were able to choose their favourite poem.

Reception have been reading The Three Billy Goats Gruff as part of their Once Upon a Time theme. Some of the children decided to re-arrange our reading area, this led to a discussion about what kinds of books the children would want to read. We noted everyone's ideas down and checked the reading area 'stock'. They suggested we have a library which the children have enjoyed so much and the coffee machine too! They have been fascinated looking at the different genres, magazines, newspapers and their choice of books.

This week **Year 4** have been reading two dramatic chapters of Christophe's Story and sequencing the events ready to perform as a story telling activity next week. We have also been learning our Makaton song for Children in Need and exploring the history of Pudsey Bear to make our own information poster.

Our story in **Nursery** this week has been **'Say hello to the jungle animals'**. The children have enjoyed learning about jungle animals and watching Andy's adventures where he has met some jungle animals. We have loved our animal puppets in the ECAT/Talk for writing area.

Year 3 have read poems by Roger McGough and Christina Rossetti. We have looked at alliteration, onomatopoeia, personification and rhyme and talked about the effect they have on poems. We have also continued to

read a selection of poems for Year 3 by Pie Corbett.


Christmas Competition Coming Soon...

Troll Stinks By Jeannie Willis & Tony Ross



On Thursday, the Year 5 and 6 children met **Kylie Dixon** – Author and illustrator of The Magical World of Mushroom Marvelous Books.

Kylie, who is from Seaham, wrote and illustrated two children's books during the last 18 months, with Book 1 selling over 500 copies in the first few months of publication. Kylie was this year's featured artist at the Durham Children's Book Festival.

Her work as an artist (with an interest in mushrooms) influenced her allotment based stories and helped her to develop her fungi characters.

Kylie talked to the children about how she achieved her dreams of becoming an artist and children's author and she spent time encouraging them to follow and achieve their own dreams.
