# **Christmas Parties**

Each class will have a Christmas party, in the same way as they did last year. We will be asking for a small donation of food to be brought in from home on the day of your child's party. This should just be a small amount and certainly does not

need to be enough to feed the whole class. If children would like to come to school in 'party clothes', that would make the day a little different for the children. Please ensure that all clothes and footwear are suitable to be worn throughout the day. Please do not send children into school wearing shoes with high heels. The exact day when your child's class will be having their party is detailed below.

It is normal school uniform for everything other than the jumper. # Recycling

We are thinking extremely hard about how we can help the environment on a day-to-day basis within school and the children have come up with some great ideas. As well as the obvious paper and cardboard recycling that happens in each classroom already, Mrs Vallons has created a display with her class in the main hall next to the lunchtime serving hatch, reminding the children the different ways in which we can help. We have set up recycling points around the school for various items. In the lunch hall we now have a recycling point



for plastic bottles that may be in packed lunch boxes (like fruit shoot bottles) and one for plastic waste (biscuit wrappers or crisp bags). Those children that have milk are not throwing away the empty cartons any more, as we have recycling points in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 to collect these in order to recycle. This also happens in the lunch hall when cartons of milk are served for lunch. The non-plastic straws are also collected, rinsed and put in our compost bins. We are also looking into creating our very own greenhouse made out of plastic bottles, in order to replace the large polytunnel. Mr Rea is researching and creating models of how to join the bottles together. Watch out in the (hopefully) near future when we may be asking for donation of empty 2 litre drinks bottles and plastic milk tubs. Obviously the bottle must be clean (especially the milk ones) and without the labels on. More information will follow.

# **School Admissions**

If your child is currently in Nursery, admissions is currently open to apply for a place in our Reception class for September 2022. The closing date for this is January 15<sup>th</sup>. If you wish to have a place at Pegswood Primary School, you must apply before this date. Although it seems a long way off, please take 10 minutes to register online and apply for your place.
