Uniform, Personal Appearance Belongings

Uniform

- Grey or black skirt, pinafore or trousers
- Red and white checked dress
- Black or grey trousers or shorts
- White shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Navy polo shirt
- Red jumper, cardigan, sweatshirt or Pegswood hoodie (red or navy)

Both boys and girls must wear sensible shoes (preferably black and not brightly coloured), suitable for spending the whole day in (no high heels or flip flops). In the warmer weather no sundresses or short tops. No make-up is allowed throughout the year in any year group.

Jewellery

Children throughout the school are allowed to wear watches.

Children in Key Stage 2 are allowed to wear one small stud earring in each ear.

PE and swimming are an essential part of the PE curriculum, but for health and safety reasons earrings and watches must not be worn for these activities. Therefore your child must be able to easily remove their earrings themselves if they are going to wear them in Key Stage 2. If they cannot remove them independently, they must not be worn.

Personal Property

Children should not bring expensive items of personal property to school. The school cannot guarantee the safety of such items. If children in Years 5 & 6 require a mobile phone for keeping in contact whilst walking home, they should place it in the class box to be locked away safely until the end of the day.

Hair

We ask that during the school year you do not allow children to arrive at school with extreme hair styles. Some examples of this would be: tramlines, Mohicans, severe differences in length on different parts of the head or dyed coloured hair. If you wish your child to have these styles, the best time is at the start of the summer holidays (not in the final weeks of term), so they can return to school with a more suitable hairstyle for the September term. Long hair must be tied back for safety reasons.
