Coronavirus procedures

As you will know, we have had our first case of Coronavirus in school today since September. With the procedures we have had in place, and with a huge slice of luck, we have survived the vast majority of the year without having to close classes. However, with cases in our community, our surrounding communities and the whole of Northumberland rising sharply, it was probably inevitable that one would strike school at some point. With our thoughts turning a little to the summer holidays (and of course the Euros final on Sunday), it can be easy to forget the situation we find ourselves in regarding Coronavirus.

In school, we will be doing nothing different to what we have done over the course of the whole year. All procedures that are currently in place will continue until the end of term.

If we are notified of a positive case in any class bubble, we will inform you that your child must self-isolate for 10 days. This will affect the whole class bubble – as it always has done since September. The only way that your child would avoid having to isolate is if they were absent from school for at least 48 hours before the positive case was in school.

Any isolation period now, would unfortunately mean that the isolating bubble would not be in school for the end of term.

Should there be a case where symptoms have been apparent in a child, in school, up to and including Sunday 18th July, and the test result comes back positive, it is school's duty to inform you that your child would need to self-isolate, if they were in the positive case's bubble. Please note that this may be after Sunday 18th July, depending on the speed of the test result. Please inform school of any test results through our email that has been running all year:

This is constantly monitored and will be, up to 6 days after the end of term.

If there are any cases when symptoms started on or after Monday 18th July, you will not have to inform school, as there will have been more than two clear days since the positive case was with their bubble.

Information regarding arrangements for next year, will be emailed to you before the start of the new school year.
