## Forthcoming building work

School is about to embark on an extensive roof repair on our front building. We have been trying for a long time to impress on the local authority about the state of our roof on the front building. I am delighted to say that part of that building will now be repaired and the vast majority of it will be completely stripped and re-laid with the Local Authority paying for the work. However, this is not a quick piece of work and may lead to pockets of disruption because of scaffolding needs. The work is due to start on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> January and will continue until the Easter holidays. Although not finalised, it is likely that the front playground will be out of action for part or all of this time. Scaffolding will also be present at the rear of the front building and there will be small areas which will be not in use for part of this time.

Usual arrangements will stay in place for dropping off and collecting children. Break times will be staggered, allowing Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 to have separate times on the rear yard. Lunchtimes will also be staggered during this time for the same reasons.

Regular meetings with the contractors will be taking place and hopefully adverse weather won't slow the project down. There will be disruption for this time but the long-term benefits for the school building will be worth it!
