What a busy week in school! Let's find out what everyone has been up to.







Year 4 children with their new books. They both read an extract to the rest of the class and explained why they chose the book.





Fascinating Fact

Farmyard robots can reduce chemical pollution.

Many farmers spray chemicals on their fields to get rid of weeds. The trouble is, these weedkillers also kill wildlife, pollute rivers and damage the soil. Swiss inventors have created a robot that targets weeds VERY precisely and cuts weedkiller use by 90%. Its camera compares photos of the plants to decide which are weeds.
