

We close tonight for half term. We return to school on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> June. This was originally a Teacher Training Day, but because we changed this at Christmas, all children will now be in school on 7<sup>th</sup> June.

<u>PE</u> Since we have returned to school from the two lockdowns we have had, we have asked children to come to school in their PE kit, rather than changing into it before the lesson and out of it at the end. Over the year, we have had time to reflect on a number of practices that we have done differently, primarily because of our Covid restrictions. However, we feel that some practices have improved the day-to-day working in school. Coming to school dressed in PE kit is one of those things. Therefore, from September we would like children to continue to come to school in PE kit on their PE days. However, we would like to reiterate what is expected as PE kit because we have felt that some children are coming to school in PE kit that is not suitable (crop tops and 'fashion' tops mainly). From September, we would like your child to come dressed in the following on their PE days:

- Jogging bottoms / leggings (shorts in warm weather is fine)
- A plain white T-shirt or a Pegswood specific white T-shirt from Emblematic
- A jumper or hoody to stay warm. This may be a Pegswood specific jumper or hoody but does not have to be

The only exception to the above is if your child will be in Years 5 or 6 in September. They may also wear the navy rugby shirt produced by Emblematic in place of either the white T-shirt or the jumper/hoody.

We feel that the above is a sensible and practical short list of clothes that most children will already have. We do not want heavily branded clothes, as it then becomes a 'logo' war, certainly amongst the older children, comparing which brands each have. Thank you.
