If your child tests positive for coronavirus, having developed symptoms <u>less than 2 days</u> since being in school (on Friday 18th or Saturday 19th December), please contact us immediately on the following email address: <u>covid@pegswood.northumberland.sch.uk</u> This would affect the class bubble and people will need to be contacted to self-isolate.

If your child tests positive for coronavirus, having developed symptoms more than 2 days since being in school (Sunday 20th December onwards), the school should not be contacted. You should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace and inform school only in the event that the isolation period runs into the start of next term. That can be done when school reopens on **Monday 4th January 2021.**
