This week, in Year 3, we have continued our new class reader called <u>'A Mummy</u> <u>Ate My Homework!'</u> by Thiago De Moraes. In our English lessons this week we have been thinking about mystery stories and have begun <u>'Ottoline and the</u> <u>Yellow Cat.'</u> by Chris Riddell.

This week **Nursery** have loved sharing <u>'The Old Lady who swallowed a fly'.</u> We have enjoyed sharing different versions of the story and singing the song.

Year 5 are getting to the really juicy bit in '<u>The Hobbit'</u> and this week enjoyed getting inside the mind of Peter Jackson, who had the challenging task of creating scenery for the films based upon Tolkien's words and sketches.

Year 6 have written some beautiful setting descriptions this week based upon an award-winning short film called <u>'Little Freak.'</u> They have really been challenged to stretch their use of vocabulary and incorporate more complex punctuation throughout their work.

The children have described both a caterpillar and butterfly and then talked about similarities and differences.
