We have also allocated all teachers and teaching assistants in to Houses, who may take part in their own competitions to win points for their Houses and of course, reap the benefits should their House win!

Attendance

Now is the time to make habits stick firm for the whole year. As with good punctuality, good attendance is crucial to the rate of progress that children make over the year. We would really like to focus on our attendance this year and as such are currently discussing a different way to reward the children with excellent attendance each term. This means stamps will not be given to spend at the bookshop. You should endeavour to bring your child into school each day unless they are too unwell to attend - coughs and colds will be dealt with in school.











It may seem like just the odd day, but odd days throughout the year add up to lost learning. If a child's attendance is 90% or lower they are classed as persistently absent by the government. We work closely with the Education Welfare Officer (EWO) for our area and persistent absence will result in referrals being sent to the Local Authority and them becoming involved. Coming to school regularly sets good patterns and there is strong evidence to show that missed days affect the children now and in the future. Thank you for your help in this. Should your child be too ill to attend school, please notify the school office before 9.30 on each day of absence.
