As we move towards a potential relaxing of coronavirus restrictions, we will digest the information when it arrives and make decisions based on the well-being of our school. It may be that there are some elements of our practice from the last couple of years that we will decide to keep, because they improve the operations within school.

Since we opened school in September 2020 after the restrictions of the spring and summer terms, we have employed a one-way system on drop off and collection. This has brought many benefits, especially reducing the congestion alongside Nursery when parents are entering school and some are exiting.
